The "Celebrating the Arts" Dayhab

Program was created to offer persons with disabilities an educational program focused on the arts. Our classes in Theatre, Dance, Music, and Visual Arts are aimed to help students achieve a higher potential while developing a sense of involvement in the community. Our "Celebrating the Arts" day program is a full day NYS Medicaid waivered program. The program runs from 9am to 2pm, Monday through Friday, all year long. Our participants range from students transitioning out of high school to senior citizens.

In our **Dayhab Without Walls (DWOW)** program, students have the opportunity to visit local galleries, libraries, free concerts, and many other events or locations. These students also take part in our arts-based curriculum.

Our **On-Site program** is a classroom setting focused on arts-based classes and continuing their education.



- Our visual arts classes encourage students to explore their unique creative expressions through drawing, painting, sculpting, and more. These sessions enhance emotional and visual motor skills while also fostering fine motor development
- Our theater classes focus on all aspects of theater productions and public speaking throughout the year. They learn songs, dialogue, assist with making sets, costumes, and more. All shows are performed for friends, family, and the community.
- Our dance classes emphasize leadership through learning choreography and supporting one another. Dance enhances cognitive, emotional, and motor skills by incorporating yoga, ballet, ballroom, jazz, tap, and musical theatre techniques in classes.
- Our music classes focus on vocal instruction. Through reciting lyrics, working on pronunciation, and memorizing songs, students improve in their emotional, communicative, cognitive, and diaphragmatic motor skills.
